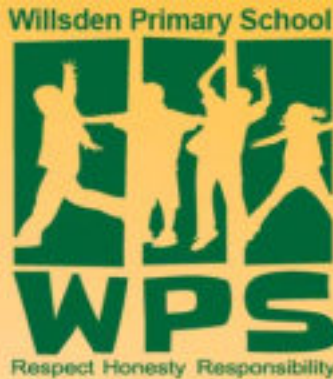

Welcome to EYPC

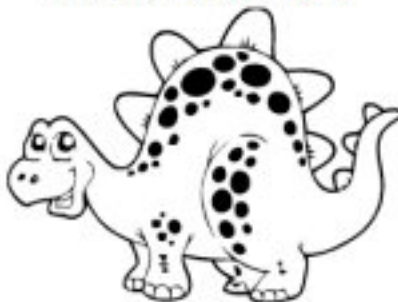
Please feel welcome to spend time at EYPC – we have an open space and a quiet room where families can enjoy having a cuppa and some play or quiet time with their children.
