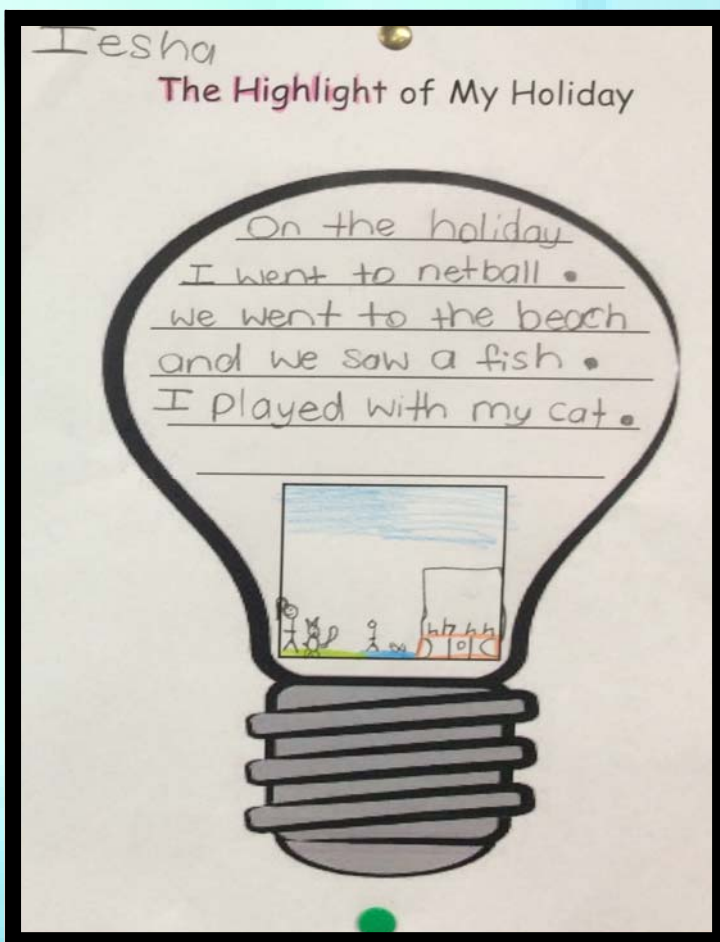

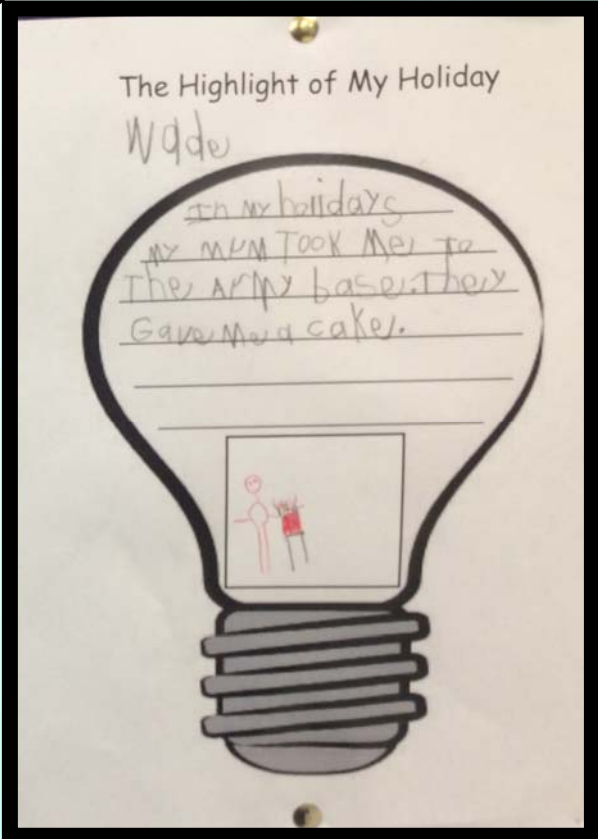
In the holidays I played netball. In the first round I was centre until the third round. In the third round I was WD. We won by ten points. We were 12 and the other team were two.

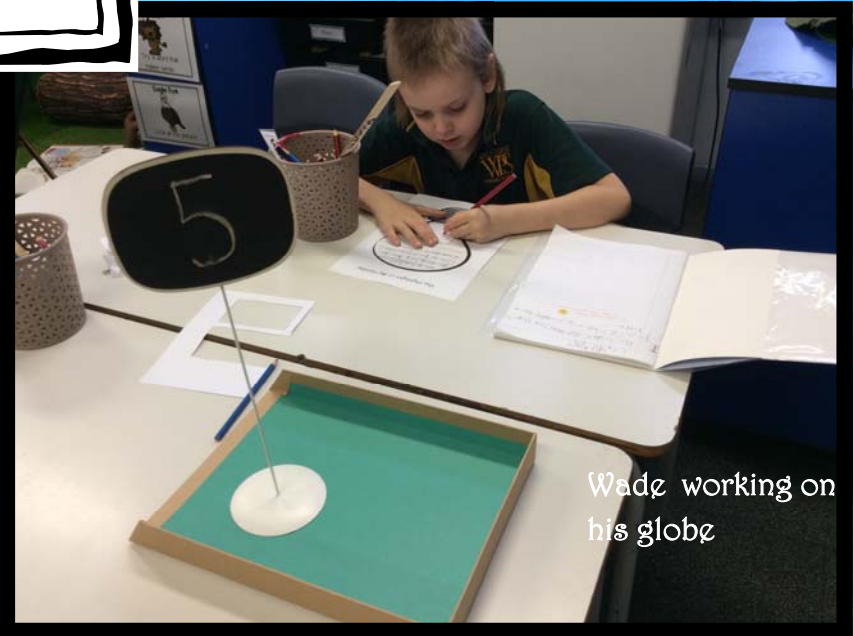

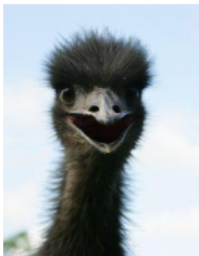
